His Peace to all,

The upcoming months of April and May are abounding in stupendous celebrations. April sees Lent passing and Easter Sunday joyously occurring. Also in April, we have the elevation of Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II to sainthood. After our inspiring April, the month of May rapidly develops as we joyously, faithfully and sincerely acknowledge the Mother of God with a May Crowning. Also, as May unfurls, we partake in the *Pride in Priests* dinner, the priestly ordinations and respectful and joyous acknowledgement of all moms on Mother's Day.

I could spend much time writing about each of the above events; however I will now delve into another significant element in our lives. A new survey finds that 84% of Americans support significant abortion restrictions. A Knights of Columbus/Marist poll also found that almost three quarters (74%) favor a ban on abortions after 20 weeks, except to save the life of a mother. The majority of Americans (53%) believe that life begins at the moment of conception and more than 62% of Americans think abortion is morally wrong. All of these great percentages show that the movement *for* life is rapidly progressing through our prayers and efforts such as the March for Life in Washington DC. Our goal of eliminating abortion is not ended, but is definitely advancing.

Faithful Navigator Message



Bishop John Joseph O'Connor, DD June 11, 1855 - May 20, 1927

Born in Newark, NJ to Irish immigrants Thomas and Catherine O'Connor, John Joseph attended St. James Parochial School in Newark, and at the age of 18, he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1873 from Seton Hall University. Bishop Winand Wigger, the presiding bishop of the Diocese, persuaded John Joseph to study at the Pontifical North American College in

Rome and at the American College of Louvain, located in Belgium. After five years of studying in Europe, he would return home to Newark, where he was ordained a priest on December 22, 1877, and went on to become a professor at Seton Hall University.

John Joseph was appointed a bishop on May 20th, 1901, and in July, he was installed as the fourth Bishop of Newark. He was made Assistant at the Pontifical Throne by Pope Pius X, on June 3rd, 1910.

Bishop John Joseph O'Connor served the Diocese of Newark for 25 years until his death on May 20th 1927. In October of that year, the Bishop O'Connor Assembly #0647 was chartered. The Assembly, currently in its 87th year, welcomed 15 new members at the March 30th Exemplification and added them to the current roster of 240 members.

We welcome our new members, and invite them to participate in the Assembly's many activities.
